ORGANIZING COMMITTEE



CUS Venezia A.S.D., affiliated with FederCUSI, has been continuously promoting sporting activities since 1949, ranging from motor and recreational sports to high-level competitive events. Each year, the CUS involves a large number of participants (around 3,000) through various forms of engagement which, thanks to their steady development, have given the organization a significant presence and influence within the Veneto sports community. Over the years, this growth has strengthened our know-how and organisational capacity, establishing CUS Venezia as a reliable institution and an important point of reference—both for local authorities, with whom we maintain effective collaborative relationships, and for official sports bodies such as CONI and the National Sports Federations.

CUS Venezia A.S.D. also boasts extensive experience in organizing major sporting events, either independently or in collaboration with Federations and Sports Associations.

CO-ORGANIZERS



The Italian Federation of University Sports (FederCUSI), formerly known as the Italian University Sports Centre (CUSI), is a National Sports Federation recognized by CONI. The State has entrusted it with the responsibility of promoting, developing, and enhancing physical education and sports activities for Italian university students.

To fulfil this mission, a University Sports Centre (CUS) is established in every Italian university city. Each CUS operates with managerial and administrative autonomy and is responsible for managing university sports facilities, organizing courses, championships, and other activities held either on campus or in external venues, all aimed at achieving the institution's educational and sporting objectives.

Each CUS reports to a University Sports Committee, established at every university. This committee includes two student representatives, two representatives of FederCUSI, the university's Administrative Director, and the Rector, who serves as its chair.

FederCUSI oversees national university sports activities, including the National University Championships (CNU) in various disciplines, as well as international activities. In collaboration with the relevant National Sports Federations, it coordinates the selection and preparation of the teams representing Italy at the University World Championships and the Universiades—an event comparable to the Olympic Games, reserved for university athletes.

The Italian Federation of University Sports is a founding member of FISU (Fédération Internationale du Sport Universitaire), the international governing body that brings together all National University Sports Associations. As such, FederCUSI participates in nearly all events organized by FISU, both in the sporting sphere (Universiades, University World Championships) and in the cultural sphere, through its involvement in conferences promoted by CESU, the body within FISU responsible for defining global strategies and objectives for university sport.

FederCUSI also has an impressive record of hosting international events, having organized four Summer Universiades, five Winter Universiades, and numerous University World Championships across various disciplines.

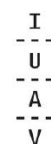

GENERAL INFO ABOUT EUSA

About EUSA

The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is an umbrella organization that comprises National University Sports Associations (NUSA) from 47 European countries, providing sporting activities, educational events, and expertise in policy making and programming. The organization is well known within the sector as a safe and strong voice for university sports in Europe, promoting fair play values and supporting their membership by partnering with European Sports Federations and lobbying within the European Union, the Council of Europe, and other institutions for funding to improve the provision of sport. EUSA is a proud and active associated member of the International University Sports Federation (FISU), strategically cooperating also with other Continental University Sports Federations (CUSF), as well as key governing bodies and organisations active in the field of sport, education, and youth.

Since its founding in 1999, EUSA has organised 16 seasons of the European Universities Championships, attracting student-athletes to 204 university competitions held across Europe. In five previous editions of the European Universities Games, around 19.500 student-athletes from across Europe have participated in the different sporting competitions organised during these multi-sports events.

Through its Institute, EUSA also engages in several social responsibility projects and initiatives on various topics, including Anti-Doping, Dual Career, Equal Opportunities and Inclusion, Good Governance, Mobility, Safeguarding, Skills Development, Sustainability, and Volunteering. Many of the projects are supported by the European Union.

EUSA EC, Commission, and Office

Highest body is the General Assembly, composed of representatives of the member associations, electing the Executive Committee. Its members are responsible for the administration and running of EUSA and the execution of main directives taken by the Assembly.

The EUSA Executive Committee is led by the President, Haris Pavletic, 1st Vice President, four Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Secretary General. Various EUSA commissions are in place to provide assistance and guidance to the many different activities EUSA is involved in. These commissions include the Technical Commission, Control Commission, Education Commission, Inclusion and Diversity Commission, Medical Commission, Student Commission, Branding and Marketing Council and also other working bodies.

EUSA's headquarters is located in Ljubljana, Slovenia, where a dedicated team of 12 staff members plus 4 volunteers/interns work together to manage daily operations and oversee international activities. As part of the European University Sports Association (EUSA), they play a vital role in supporting the development and promotion of university sports across Europe, ensuring smooth coordination of events, effective communication, and strong collaboration among member organizations.

This includes:

- immediate rescue by dedicated emergency team
- on-site medical evaluation
- transportation to the nearest hospital by ambulance or helicopter
- emergency medical treatment of the injury

All skiers will be responsible for any damages or injuries caused to third parties. In Italy since 2022 this insurance is mandatory for all skiers.

Skiers may use their own insurance if they have it, or purchase a temporary insurance for the ski-pass duration at **3 euros per day**.

1. Live the winter mountain with respect

The Dolomites UNESCO are a world heritage site: protect snow, rocks, woods, and landscapes by following the principles of the Foundation and the event guidelines.

2. Leave the snow untouched

Avoid leaving the slopes, do not create ruts or damage snow layers, and respect fauna resting areas, particularly vulnerable in winter.

3. Move sustainably

Use shuttles, car-pooling, and public transport: reduce traffic, emissions, and noise in the Dolomite valleys.

4. Reduce waste and litter

Bring water bottles, reusable containers, and correctly dispose of waste and technical materials. In the mountains, waste lasts a long time.

5. Use energy and heating responsibly

In hotels and lodges, limit unnecessary consumption, avoid leaving windows open, and turn off unused appliances.

6. Respect winter ecosystems

Fauna survives winter with limited energy: keep distances, avoid loud noises, and respect sensitive areas indicated by the Organizing Committee and the Dolomiti UNESCO Foundation.

7. Value local culture and economy

Choose local products, craftsmanship, services, and structures applying sustainable practices; support those who live in and protect the mountains year-round.

8. Choose sustainable technical materials

Prefer certified clothing, skis, and equipment that are recycled or low impact, in line with Ministry of Sport recommendations.

8. Reduce energy consumption

Do not leave lights, appliances, or heating active without need in accommodation facilities.
